Help for women in Vienna and Austria

Unfortunately, women in all countries of the world experience disadvantages, discrimination and violence because they are women. All women and girls can be affected, in private as well as in the public. They have to experience these things even when they are fleeing and looking for refuge. This is why many countries started to establish specific institutions for women and their children. Attached is a list of support facilities you can turn to for help and support, if you have any questions or if you simply want to exchange ideas about your situation. Help and support are free of charge.

This flyer was made to support and encourage Ukrainian women and their children fleeing to Austria to ask for help whenever they encounter violence.

Important general emergency numbers

- **Whenever you face acute danger, please call the police immediately! Emergency number 133 or 112** (Europ. emergency)

- Important! Emergency numbers can be called without any SIM card and without any phone credits!
- If you cannot hear or cannot make a phone call, **send a text message to the following number: 0800 133 133** (Please do not forget to give your address!)
- You can also trigger an emergency call to the police via the **smartphone app DEC112** (you need to register first).

Support for women

Women's help line (*Frauenhelpline*) is for all women and girls experiencing violence and in need of help. You can call it 24/7 from all over Austria and is free-of-charge.¹ All help is confidential; no information is forwarded to anybody. You can also receive help or counselling anonymously and without mentioning your name.

Frauenhelpline also has a **help chat**. It provides **women and girls with support in Russian**.

We can help you in the following languages: Arabic, Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian (BCS), English, Romanian, Spanish, Turkish and Dari-Farsi, and by the hour and by arrangement also in Ukrainian and Russian.

In Austria, the police are obligated to protect victims in their personal area of life. Persons who are violent can be evicted from your apartment for 2 weeks. They can also be prohibited from contacting the victim. *Wiener Interventionsstelle*, called *Gewaltschutzzentren*² in the different Austrian Federal Provinces, get reports on evictions by the police. Their task is to then actively contact the victims and offer them help and practical support.

Languages: At the *Wiener Interventionsstelle* you can receive **help in Russian**. We offer **counselling in Ukrainian via video**, if necessary.

- **24-hour emergency hotline for women (24-Stunden Frauennotruf) of the City of Vienna + 43 1 71 71 9 – around the clock**

The **24-hour emergency hotline for women (24-Stunden Frauennotruf)** helps women and girls in case of violence against them, and is available 24 hours a day. Help is free-of-charge and confidential. You will get help anonymously,

without stating your name if you do not want to. Girls from the age of 14 receive counselling and help in case of sexualised, physical or psychological violence.

Language: Individual counselling by means of **video interpreting in Ukrainian and in Russian**. Please request an appointment. Additionally support is offered in Bosnian/Croatian/Serbian (BCS), English, Farsi, Polish and Spanish.

- **Wiener Frauenhäuser (women's refuge), women's refuge emergency line: 05 77 22 – 24/7**

Wiener Frauenhäuser provide women who experience violence through their (ex-) partner temporary accommodation, psychosocial and legal counselling. Children live together with their mothers in a residential unit. The addresses are confidential due to safety reasons, any contact is made via telephone.

Languages: **Counselling in Ukrainian and Russian** (and many other languages) is possible via video interpreting.

Women's counselling by *Diakonie Flüchtlingsdienst* (Diakonie social services refugee service) provides multi-lingual counselling for refugee women and has established its own **counselling centre for women fleeing Ukraine**.

There are two female counsellors available. Language: Ukrainian interpreters on site.

The Intervention Centre for Trafficked Women (LEFÖ-IBF) is a recognised victim protection centre. We provide unconditional support, customised to your individual needs, psychosocial and legal trial process support, safe accommodation with socio-cultural care in protected accommodation for affected women and girls from the age of 15 years. Queer Base provides regular counselling on asylum and LGBTIQ+ topics. Together with several partners they organise accommodations for LGBTIQ+ asylum seekers.

Language: We provide counselling in **Ukrainian**. Additionally, also in English and other languages.

Queer Base primarily works with interpreters who are LGBTIQ+ themselves.

Queer Base Café, an open meeting, takes place every Thursday at 6 pm.
